1946 Shortly after WWII,

Jim Wagner worked several jobs around the outskirts of Denver to make ends meet and support his growing family. After taking on a few side projects, landscaping neighbors' yards, he decided to make it his full time business. The company...Guaranteed Landscape.

On a small scale, Jim worked hard to develop standards of which he would not sacrifice. As his business grew, he started to build waterfalls and install rock gardens. Word spread all over the Denver area of his impeccable quality and craftsmanship. He became known for setting large boulders in a way that reflected the mountain they came from.

Another trademark of his reputation was his customer service. After every project was completed, he would walk through with the customer to ensure satisfaction and completion of the contract.

Three sons worked into the business and expanded the capabilities of the company. With updated heavy equipment, the company

focused and perfected the art of building stunning water features and boulder retaining walls.

In the 1980s this company was credited with moving and setting the largest boulder in Colorado. This enormous boulder weighed in excess of 65 tons. Guaranteed Landscape would always accommodate large and small projects, from simple, residential garden ponds to larger scale water features for AT&T, John Elway, and Dan Reeves. In the late 80s, the company partners separated and moved out of the area. My father, Bob Wagner settled in southwest Montana and re-established his landscape company in 1991.

Today that company is Wagner and Company. For over 25 years, this company has served your area, always maintaining the excellence that has always been our trademark. Today I work with my father as a partner in the company and I am thankful for the roots that I have.

My grandfather passed away early this spring, but his legacy will live on through a company he created 75 years ago. Uncompromising standards, unmatched quality, and a long list of customers that will never forget the services they received. FEATURED PROJECT:

Wagner and Company was called to landscape a new guest home that previous customers had just constructed. They wanted the new guest home to match the existing main house design while retaining the difficult terrain around the home.

Wagner and Co. needed to provide stone and masonry work to match the main house, complete with slab benches around the deck area. Moss rock retaining added in front of the deck gave the appearance the home was

built on an outcropping, without disturbing the natural landscape of the area around it. A fireplace was set with matching stone and benches to enjoy the evening view of the property. A manageable lawn adds an area for kids and adults to play and congregate.

Native plants blend the area back into the surrounding mountain landscape, making the home inviting and attractive. Both homes are connected using stone step paths and ornamental boulders. A mix of native grass and wildflowers surround the landscape with lots of color.
